

Australian Passports Act 2005 — Authorisations and Delegations 2015

I, JULIE ISABEL BISHOP, Minister for Foreign Affairs, acting under sections 51 and 52 of the *Australian Passports Act 2005* (the Act) and section 29 of the Australian Passports Determination 2015 (the Determination):

- (a) Revoke all previous delegations and authorisations made for this purpose;
- (b) Authorise the persons marked by an asterisk to exercise the powers, and to perform the functions, of an officer mentioned in the delegate column of Schedule 1 in which those persons are mentioned as delegates; and
- (c) Delegate my powers under each provision of the Act or the Determination mentioned in Schedule 1 to each person holding, occupying or performing the duties of a position, and each authorised person, mentioned in the delegate column of Schedule 1.

Effective from the 8th day of OCTOBER 2015.

Austrade Officer on a short-term mission	An officer employed by Austrade and posted to an Australian mission on a short-term mission or short-term assignment.		
Australian Passport	A passport issued under the Act and includes a full validity, limited validity, diplomatic, official and emergency passport.		
Australian Travel Document	An Australian passport or an Australian travel-related document.		
Australian Travel- Related Document	A document issued under s9 of the Act and includes a Convention Travel Document, a Certificate of Identity, a Document of Identity and a Provisional Travel Document.		
Australian Postal Corporation Employee	Employee or agent of the Australian Postal Corporation who is accredited to provide passport agency services under an agreement between the Australian Postal Corporation and DFAT.		
CEC Officer	An officer working in the Consular Emergency Centre in DFAT.		
Competent Authority	A competent authority as defined in sections 12, 13, 14 or 16 of the Act.		
Consular Officer	A consular officer of an Australian consulate, being a person who is a consular officer (but not an Honorary Consular Officer) within the meaning of the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations (VCCR).		
Contractor	Contractor means:		
	A person engaged under contract with DFAT, to perform functions for the Australian Passport Office pursuant to Part 5 of the Australian Passports Act 2005.
